

Chapter Quality Network ADHD Project: MOC Requirements Cheat Sheet

To receive American Board of Pediatrics (ABP) Maintenance of Certification (MOC) Part 4 Credit, the ABP requires each individual physician to actively participate in the project.

To be considered an active participant in the Chapter Quality Network (CQN) ADHD project and receive MOC points, pediatricians must meet two levels of requirements: practice-level and individual.

MOC Part 4 Criteria for the Practice

- Establish core quality improvement (QI) team (physician; nurse, nurse practitioner or medical assistant; and practice manager).
- Members of core QI team attend learning sessions.
- Members of core QI team attend monthly calls with their chapter.
- Document reliable diagnosis and treatment processes at the time of the visit (flow charts).
- Run a billing query to identify the practice's ADHD population during action period two, which will aid in teaching practices to manage their entire ADHD population.
- Complete bi-monthly practice survey to provide project feedback and assess progress using the ABP Improvement Progress Scale.

MOC Part 4 Criteria for the Physician

- Attend practice core QI team meetings at least once a month.
- Review improvement data on a monthly basis with practice core QI team.
- Enter relevant patient data into the mehealth for ADHD portal and collect parent and teacher rating scales (Vanderbilt assessments) through the portal.
- Establish patient demographics in the mehealth for ADHD portal for an average of 5 unique patients (ages 4-17) per month over 9 data collection cycles. These unique patients may be new patients or existing patients.

The CQN ADHD project will award 25 MOC points to physicians who actively participate in the entire project and fulfill the requirements above. The project will have 11 data collection cycles from January 2016 through November 2016.
