Thank you for your interest in Store It Safe Awareness Month! We are excited that you will partner with us to keep children safe by raising awareness of the risks of and ways to prevent unintentional injuries to children by unsecured firearms.

During November 2017, the Partnership for the Safety of Children Around Firearms and the Ohio Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics will be sharing messages to raise awareness of 3 key messages and 3 simple actions that can help keep kids safe:

Store It Safe Awareness Month Key Messages

1. Store it Safe! Ensure all firearms are secured in a lock box when not on the body of the owner
2. Talk to kids about firearm safety – even if there isn't a firearm in their home or if all firearms in the home are secured
3. Ask about the presence and storage of firearms in homes children will be visiting – Asking Saves Kids!

Store It Safe Awareness Month Partner Actions

1. Distribute this toolkit to everyone in your network
2. Share the messages in this toolkit on social media
3. Talk with the children, parents and families in your life about firearm safety

These actions require very little commitment of time or resources, but have potentially high impact on the risks facing children in Ohio. If all advocates for child safety shared these messages throughout November, millions of families could easily be reached. Today we are asking you to commit to spreading the word to keep kids safe by taking the 3 partner actions described above. “Store It Safe” Family Fact Sheet

About the Program

The Ohio Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics has teamed up with firearm owners, pediatricians and others to create The Partnership for Safety of Children Around Firearms, and a program called **Store It Safe**.

Store It Safe is about keeping children safe from accidental firearm deaths. To help achieve this goal we are encouraging pediatricians and office staff to discuss firearm safety at well-child visits.

Additional Ways to Keep Your Young Child Safe

Since your child is more mobile, it is important to set up your home to keep your child safe. Here are a few ideas to consider:

- **Firearms should always be stored out of sight and locked when not in immediate possession of the firearm owner.** When a firearm is not on the body of its owner, it should always be stored in a lock box so children cannot access it. Even children as young as 3 years old can pull the trigger of a firearm. Also, older children can be curious and should not be able to access the owner’s firearm.
- **Keep medicines and household cleaners out of your child’s reach.** Household products, medicines and sharp objects should be stored locked in high places out of the child’s sight and reach.
- **Fence in your pool or hot tub on all 4 sides.** Drowning is the second leading cause of injury-related death of children nationally in this age group. If you have a disposable pool, remove water from it when not in use.
- **Check for hazards in homes your child may visit.** Other homes, especially those with no children or older children, may pose hazards from poisonings, falls, pools and firearms.

“Store It Safe” Physician Fact Sheet

About the Program

The Ohio Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics has teamed up with firearm owners, pediatricians and others to create The Partnership for Safety of Children Around Firearms, and a program called **Store It Safe**.

Store It Safe is about keeping children safe from accidental firearm deaths. To help achieve this goal we are encouraging pediatricians and office staff to discuss firearm safety at well-child visits starting at age 2.

Suggestions for productive dialogue

- Safe firearm storage should be incorporated into the normal safety discussion of a well child visit – just as you would talk about safe storage of medications, harmful chemicals, etc.
- Between 30-40% of Ohio homes have firearms, so assume that your patient’s family has a firearm in the home.
- Ask about firearm storage in a non-judgmental way.
 - Instead of asking “Do you have a firearm in the home?” ask “If there is a firearm in the home, is it kept locked and away from children?”
 - If yes, great
 - If no, there is an opportunity for education about **Store It Safe**
 - If the response is “we don’t own a firearm” then the healthcare provider should still encourage the parents talk to the child about firearm safety, because chances are that the child is going into another home where there is a firearm

MEDIA Q&A:

Q: Why did you start Store It Safe Awareness Month?

A: When we looked at the information on accidental shootings and adolescent suicides, it was clear we needed to pull resources together to address this growing issue.

- Nationally, 1 out of 3 homes with kids has a firearm, and nearly 1.7 million kids live in a home with a loaded and unlocked firearm.
- An accidental firearm injury has occurred to a child in one-fourth of Ohio counties since 2015.

However, evidence supports that safe firearm storage can prevent accidental shootings and adolescent suicides.

Q: What are the goals of Store It Safe Awareness Month?

A: The goals of Store It Safe Awareness Month are:

- To increase awareness of ways to prevent firearm-related unintentional deaths and suicides among children and teens
- To change our approach in talking about firearm safety
- To Store it Safe and teach children safety around firearms

Q: Who are your partners in this campaign?

A: The Ohio Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics (Ohio AAP) has teamed up with firearm owners, pediatricians and others to create the Partnership for Safety of Children Around Firearms, and the Store it Safe program, to encourage safe storage of firearms and educate families about safety issues. Store It Safe Awareness Month is supported by Buckeye Firearms Association, Black Wing Shooting Center, Kiwanis Club of Columbus, Columbus Division of Police and many other interested parties.

Store it Safe Awareness Month Encourages Safe Firearm Storage Discussions in November

Columbus, OHIO – The Ohio Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics (Ohio AAP) has teamed up with firearm owners, pediatricians and others to launch **Store It Safe Awareness Month**, to encourage safe storage of firearms and educate families about safety issues. Nationally, 1 out of 3 homes with kids has a firearm, and nearly 1.7 million kids live in a home with a loaded and unlocked firearm.

“Twenty-five percent of Ohio counties have had firearm-related accidental injuries and deaths in children under 18 since 2015,” said Melissa Werver Arnold, CEO, Ohio Chapter, American Academy of Pediatrics. “It was clear we needed to address this growing issue using evidence based practices, including educating families on the importance of safe firearm storage.”
