An increasing body of research supports the need to address the impacts of implicit, or unconscious, bias in healthcare. Implicit bias is not limited to race—it can exist for characteristics such as gender, age, socioeconomic status, and physical appearance; studies found healthcare professionals experience bias in the same proportions as the general population. The impacts of implicit bias play an important role in child abuse prevention, where following unbiased procedures can lead to lifesaving interventions.

This training will assist healthcare professionals in learning to recognize and prevent bias when interacting with families and children, and share on innovative technologies in bias training.

In a study of **200 abused children**, at least **4 children died** due to missed sentinel injuries.

Research shows **implicit bias has significant impacts** on: patient-provider interactions, treatment decisions, and patient health outcomes.

In one year, **153 minor victims of human trafficking** were identified in Ohio.

Clinics who participate in social determinant of health screening programs have **less CPS reports** and medical neglect, according to studies.
