In one year, 153 minor victims of human trafficking were identified in Ohio. Human trafficking victims can be of any age, race, gender, or nationality and come from any socioeconomic group. Victims often come from vulnerable groups, and are coerced, threatened, or forced by traffickers. Minors are especially vulnerable and can experience long term effects on their emotional, physical, and psychological development.

In one afternoon, this training will assist healthcare professionals in learning to assess for human trafficking and risks, and utilize best practices for suspected cases.

In a study of **200 abused children**, at least **4 children died** due to missed sentinel injuries.

Research shows **implicit bias has significant impacts** on: patient-provider interactions, treatment decisions, and patient health outcomes.

In one year, **153 minor victims of human trafficking** were identified in Ohio.

Clinics who participate in social determinant of health screening programs have **less CPS reports** and medical neglect, according to studies.
